

Learn about the Proposed ETJ Expansion

The Town of Fuquay-Varina has submitted a request to Wake County to expand its extra-territorial jurisdiction (ETJ) by 22,049 acres. The Town's current ETJ (as of July 2, 2018) totals 8,739 acres.

This is NOT an annexation. Property in the ETJ is NOT in Town limits so property owners do NOT pay Town taxes. The ETJ is the area outside Fuquay-Varina's Town limits but subject to Town zoning and development regulations. The Town of Fuquay-Varina has proposed to expand its ETJ to responsibly manage the growth that continues to occur in Wake County. The ETJ expansion will ensure that new development meets Town standards, including improvements to the street network, that would otherwise not be required in the County.

Erosion Control Program

The N.C. Sedimentation Pollution Control Act was established in 1973 to protect our water and the NCSCC grants authority to local governing bodies to implement those regulations. In September, the Town of Fuquay-Varina received authority to begin performing all erosion control plan reviews and issue and renew all land disturbance permits for development with disturbance totaling an acre or more within the town limits and ETJ. The responsibility was previously handled by Wake County.
