



## *Mayoral Proclamation*

- WHEREAS** Fuquay-Varina is at risk for a multitude of hazards including severe weather, terrorism, biological events, hazardous materials incidents, nuclear emergencies, and other man-made or natural disasters; and
- WHEREAS** communities across Wake County have experienced significant hazmat incidents, emergency situations, and severe weather; and
- WHEREAS** every community, business, family, and individual in Fuquay-Varina is encouraged to be ready for natural and man-made disasters including terrorism, tornadoes, flooding, hurricanes, and other emergency situations that might disrupt normal daily activities; and
- WHEREAS** all Fuquay-Varina residents can take steps such as– making a family disaster plan, creating an emergency supply kit, and staying informed – to help make preparedness and personal responsibility a priority; and
- WHEREAS** Fuquay-Varina residents should know and understand the risks for their area and plan accordingly, and
- WHEREAS** Fuquay-Varina recommends residents include the safety of their pets and/or livestock in their emergency plans; and
- WHEREAS** FEMA and the Office of the President of the United States recognize September as National Preparedness Month to encourage Fuquay-Varina residents to be disaster ready.

**NOW, THEREFORE I, J. BLAKE MASSENGILL, MAYOR** of the Town of Fuquay-Varina, NC proclaim the month of September 2022, as “**PREPAREDNESS MONTH**” in Fuquay-Varina, and encourage all residents to plan and prepare for weather-related and man-made disasters by assembling their emergency supply kits and updating their emergency plans.
